Front Page

Back Page

For the front page of the card, you will draw a colorful design to represent the holiday.

The back page should be left blank.



Inside Top

Choose a scripture verse or thoughtful holiday-themed message. You may use the ideas below as inspiration or choose your own.

- "Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way, it is not irritable or resentful, it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." – 1 Corinthians 13:4-7

Inside Bottom

On the bottom of the inside page, each student should write a personalized message to the incarcerated person.

The greeting should say something like, "Dear Friend" or "Dear Brother or Sister". This message can be religious or secular, but should be optimistic and cheerful. It can express holiday-related messages, as well as general encouragement.

The goal is to spread love and kindness at Mother's Day.

The card can be signed with a student's first name and grade, with a closing such as "Love, Kayla, a 9th Grade Student". The last name should not be included.
